Certificate Program ARPA Supplemental Sub-Grant

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the ARPA Supplemental Sub-Grant Program?

The Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Child Care Development Fund Certificate Program (CCDF) has received funding from the Administration of Children and Families and the Office of Child Care. This funding will be used to provide assistance to CCDF eligible child care providers, including before/after school care providers.

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) has provided resources to the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Child Care Development Fund - Early Childhood Education Center's Certificate Program (SRPMIC-ECEC Certificate Program) programs to distribute supplemental grants to childcare providers participating in the Certificate Program to ensure that childcare centers/providers maintain a high level of quality childcare and is available to support families and businesses as the economy recovers. Providers using this grant will support the ARP Act CCDF Discretionary Supplemental Funds and may apply for the grant award to assist in the program's operating costs for the child care center to support building the supply of Child Care for Underserved Populations.

Who is eligible for this grant funds?

- State-Licensed family home or childcare providers that are licensed through the state of Arizona;
- Any providers licensed after March 11, 2021 must contract with DES in order to qualify for grant funding;
- Any childcare provider that has at least one child enrolled in the SRPMIC-ECEC Certificate Program from October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023 and;
- Not received any grants or reimbursement for Rent/Mortgages and/or Utilities from the Administration
 of Children and Families and the Office of Child Care or AZ Department of Economic Services or any
 other tribal agencies.

How much is awarded with the ARPA Supplemental Sub-Grant?

 Child Care provider may apply to receive reimbursements for their operating costs that cover rent/mortgages and utilities of their facility for up to \$60,000* during October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023 grant period. *Depending on how many providers apply and receive funds, additional funds may be available.

What can the grant funds be used to cover?

- Rent/Mortgages for the center or facility.
- Utilities Electricity, Gas, Water, Sewer, Trash, Phone and/or Internet.

How can a provider apply for the ARPA Supplemental Sub-Grant?

Programs who wish to apply for a sub-grant must follow the procedure listed below:

- Complete the ARPA Supplemental Sub-Grant application.
- Email the application to SRPMIC-ECEC Certificate Program for consideration.

If a provider has multiple sites does each site have to apply for the grant funding?

Yes, each site must apply separately, as long as each site is serving at least one child in the Certificate Program during October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023 grant period.

Does the Child Care Provider need to be an 'Active Provider' with the SRPMIC- Certificate Program?

Yes, an 'Active Provider' is defined as is center serving at least one child in the Certificate Program during October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023 grant period.

What is the duration of the ARPA Supplemental Sub-Grant Program?

Providers may apply for the grant during the fiscal year October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023 grant period.

If I am receiving funds or reimbursement from any type of grant program or DES to pay for my rent/mortgage and utilities, am I still eligible for these funds?

Providers may not have received any grants or reimbursement for Rent/Mortgages and/or Utilities from other funded programs of the Administration of Children and Families, Office of Child Care or AZ Department of Economic Services or any other tribal agencies.

Do providers need to save and submit receipts associated with this grant?

Providers must keep records of all supporting documentation submitted to the SRPMIC-ECEC Certificate Program. All receipts and documentation should be retained for your records and for auditing purposes for up to three years of receiving the last amount of funds for the grant.

Will child care centers be required to provide relief to families?

The Certificate Program is requesting that providers relieve any overages to families enrolled in the child care certificate program beyond the subsidy reimbursement, to the extent possible, and prioritize such relief for families struggling to make their payment and any other additional charges. We are asking centers to be prepared as we may request data from child care providers; for example, if they were able to provide relief, for how many families and the amount. We will use this data to report back to our Education Board, Tribal Council and the Office of Child Care.

When my application gets approved, what happens next?

- Once the application has been reviewed and approved; providers will be notified by email and be given the
 expense report to complete and submit along with any supporting documentation.
- SRPMIC-ECEC Certificate Program staff will work on the reimbursement for rent/mortgage and utilities that
 are listed on the expense report. Child Care providers will receive payment in the same form as subsidy
 reimbursements.

How long does it take to receive funds after I turn in the expense report and supporting documents?

Once the Certificate Program receives all required and completed documentation, funds can take a minimum of 4-6 weeks.
